Our Story



In 2001 Steve Alloy, president of Stanley Martin Homes, was serving on the board of the Alternative House now Second Story, Northern Virginia's only emergency homeless shelter for teens at the time. The building was in disrepair because all of the money was going into the programs for the kids.

At the same time, Don Knutson, then the local president of Beazer homes, heard from his Chairman, who served on the HomeAid America (HAA) national board, who asked, 'HAA would love to start a chapter on the east coast; do you think that would work in the Washington, D.C. area?'

Don called Steve with an idea for scaling the HomeAid blueprint in the region, and Steve told Don about the teen shelter. And with that, a new chapter was launched and HomeAid Northern Virginia had its first project.

In 2022 HomeAid Northern Virginia rebranded and changed its name to HomeAid National Capital Region allowing us to broaden our reach, serve more people and collaborate with new partners.





BUILDER CAPTAINS


HomeAid National Capital Region has worked with 60 different Builder Captains to complete 163 construction projects.

A community-based donation drive started in 2018, aimed at collecting diapers and wipes for babies and toddlers experiencing or at risk of experiencing homelessness in our community.

Since the program was started eight years ago, we have completed 41 Turnover Projects and invested \$251,704 back into the community


PROJECT PLAYHOUSE


